Self-Drive Journeys



Follow South Australia's stunning coastline of Eyre Peninsula, the Seafood Capital of Australia.

DAY 01: Adelaide to Port Augusta (305 km)

Make your way along the Princes Highway to the seaport town of Port Pirie, to stop for morning tea. Continue to Port Augusta known as the Crossroads of Australia. Visit the acclaimed Wadlata Outback Centre, where you learn about the 'Tunnel of Time'. Rest of the day is at leisure.

DAY 02: Port Augusta to Port Lincoln (345 km)

Depart for Port Lincoln. Visit Whyalla, home to a thriving oyster industry. Continue south to Port Lincoln, the 'Seafood Capital of Australia.' Rest of the day at your leisure discovering all that Port Lincoln has to offer.

DAY 03: Port Lincoln

Explore Port Lincoln and the surrounding area at your leisure. Discover Coffin Bay National Park and Lincoln National Park, or visit Coffin Bay where you can sample the famous Coffin Bay oysters. For the adventurous consider cage diving with Great White sharks or swim with sea lions and tuna (own expense).

DAY 04: Port Lincoln to Ceduna (403 km)

Depart Port Lincoln and travel along the Flinders Highway. Stop off at Streaky Bay where you can sample freshly caught seafood.. Visit a five metre replica Great White shark at the Streaky Bay Shell Roadhouse. Continue towards to Ceduna, also well-known for its oysters. Spend rest of the day at leisure exploring the town.

DAY 05: Ceduna to Port Augusta (471 km)

Make your way back to Port Augusta. Stop at the township of Wudinna and if time permits discover Mount Wudinna. Learn about the rock formation and history, before walking to the top for it's amazing views. Depart Wudinna and journey back to Port Augusta. This afternoon take the Heritage Walk and learn about the history of the town.

DAY 06:Port Augusta to Adelaide (307 km)

Leave Port Augusta and drive towards Adelaide. Visit Port Pirie along the way, before arriving into Adelaide.

Note your car is booked until tomorrow and should be dropped off at the city or airport, by the same time as it was picked up on Day 1, to avoid any additional charges.



Self-Drive Journeys



Venture into the heart of Australia, meet local characters and discover rugged ranges and vast plains.

Day 1: Adelaide to Port Augusta (305 km)

There is a choice of routes to take to Port Augusta today. The most direct way is through Port Pirie. This is quite a pleasant drive and will take around 4 hours. A more scenic drive is via Clare. The wineries around Clare are well worth a visit. From here travel on to Gladstone, the small town of Wilmington and to Port Augusta, the last major centre along the road linking Western Australia with South Australia.

Day 2: Port Augusta to Coober Pedy (540 km)

Travel north on the Stuart Highway into the real outback and desert of Australia. Travel on to the unique township of Coober Pedy where most of the population live underground in dug-outs to protect them from the severe summer temperatures, often reaching 45C.

Day 3: Coober Pedy to Marla (234 km)

Explore Coober Pedy before leaving, continue travelling north on the Stuart Highway and pass through Cadney Homestead and onto Marla, which marks the start of the famous Oodnadatta Track.

Day 4: Marla to Ayers Rock (517 km)

Continue travelling through Kulgera, and then to Erldunda and then turn off to Ayers Rock and Yulara Resort. This afternoon head out to the Rock, we suggest taking a slow drive around it before heading to "Sunset Strip" to see the famous Uluru.

Day 5: Ayers Rock

Spend the day at leisure to explore all that the region has to offer. Take a walk around the Rock, a visit to the Cultural Centre, a Harley ride around the Rock or a scenic flight. Try a picnic lunch at the Olgas and a walk through the Valley of the Winds with the view of the spectacular sunset.

Day 6: Ayers Rock to Kings Canyon (321 km)

This morning is at leisure to explore more of Ayers Rock. You may wish to rise early to experience the beautiful sunrise over Uluru or take a walk into the majestic Olga Gorge. Leave Ayers Rock on Lasseter Highway and pass by the majestic flat topped mountain, Mt Conner. Turn left and take the Luritja Road to Kings Canyon. Skirt the rim of the Canyon and hold your breath as you gaze 300 metres down to the valley floor. The soaring sandstone walls frame the "Garden of Eden", a unique waterhole surrounded by palms and ferns. The best time of day for the Kings Canyon Rim Walk is early in the morning when it is cool.

Day 7: Kings Canyon to (Alice Springs 474 km) OR Kings Canyon to Alice Springs via the Mereenie Loop Road (322 km) 4WD access only

We recommend taking the Rim Walk at Kings Canyon early this morning, but it will be a very early morning to allow you enough time to drive onto Alice Springs. Depart Kings Canyon and return to the Lasseter Highway and turn left. Pass the Henbury Meteorite craters, formed around 4,700 years ago. Take the Stuart Highway north to Alice Springs. Spend the rest of the day exploring this beautiful part of the Australian Outback.

Your vehicle will need to be return tomorrow by the same time it was collected on Day 1, to avoid additional charges.

DAY 01: Adelaide to Barossa (60 km)

Travel to Barossa, one of Australia's most significant wine regions. The Barossa is famous for its Shiraz, Eden Valley Riesling and other premium wines, regional produce and acclaimed restaurants. Visit well known wine producers such as Penfolds Barossa, Saltram Wine Estate, Wolf Blass and Jacob's Creek.

DAY 02: Barossa

Today is at leisure to further explore this famous wine region. Follow one of the many food and wine trails, visit the local farmer's markets or stop in to taste gourmet local produce at Maggie Beer's Farm Shop.

DAY 03: Barossa to McLaren Vale (105 km)

Travel through the Adelaide Hills to explore some of the 33 cellar doors, vineyards and orchards. Stop at Hahndorf, the oldest surviving German settlement in Australia. Continue onto Strathalbyn, before arriving at McLaren Vale.

DAY 04: McLaren Vale

A full day to explore the famous wine region of McLaren Vale, known for its Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Grenache, Merlot and Chardonnay.

DAY 05: McLaren Vale to Kangaroo Island (74 km) Penneshaw (at Ferry terminal) to American River 40km; Flinders Chase 150km

Make your way to Cape Jervis for a 45 minute ferry to Kangaroo Island. The island is Australia's third largest, boasting spectacular coastal scenery and landscapes, national parks, and wildlife experiences. Visit Seal Bay Conservation Park for a chance to walk amongst Sea Lions, see the dramatic formations of Remarkable Rocks and Admirals Arch in Flinders National Park.

DAY 06: Kangaroo Island

Continue exploring the island at leisure. Visit the beautiful secluded beaches of the north coast or enjoy the island's locally produced sheep cheeses and yoghurt, wine, eucalyptus oil, honey and delicious seafood. For a hit of adventure, visit Little Sahara and surf down huge sand dunes.

DAY 07: Kangaroo Island to Adelaide (107 km) Penneshaw (at Ferry terminal) from American River 40km; Flinders Chase 150km

Depart Kangaroo Island, taking the ferry from Penneshaw to Cape Jervis. Return to Adelaide at leisure.

Your vehicle will need to be return tomorrow by the same time it was collected on Day 1, to avoid additional charges.

Discover South Australia's best known wine region and drive the scenic Great Ocean Road.

DAY 01: Adelaide to Kangaroo Island (107 km to Cape Jervis)

Make your way to Cape Jervis for a 45 minute ferry to Kangaroo Island. The coastline of the island changes from the attractive curved beach at Emu Bay. On the west are two of the island's natural wonders; Admirals Arch, and the Remarkable Rocks

DAY 02: Kangaroo Island

Today you have time to explore the natural beauty of this island and discover Australian wildlife – in the wild! Highlights include Flinders Chase National Park, Kelly Hill Caves, the "Koala Walk" and the seals at Seal Bay.

DAY 03: Kangaroo Island to Victor Harbour (60 km)

Depart Kangaroo Island, taking the ferry from Penneshaw to Cape Jervis and drive to Victor Harbour. At Victor Harbour walk across the Causeway or take the horse drawn tram to explore Granite Island.

DAY 04: Victor Harbour to Robe (354 km)

Travel up north making your way towards Murray Bridge, then around Lake Alexandria, skirting through Lake Albert. You will then travel along the coast, along Coorong National Park before you reach Robe. Robe was once a thriving ships port and prides itself on the preservation of the town's history.

DAY 05: Robe to Port Fairy (291 km - or via the Grampians 487 km)

A choice of routes is available. The shorter route will take you via Millicent, and on to Mount Gambier and then along the coast to Portland and then onto Port Fairy. The longer route means a very early start, from Robe travel to Mt Gambier and then through the towns of Hamilton, Coleraine and Casterton and onto Dunkeld. From Dunkeld a scenic drive will take you through the Grampians National Park and onto Halls Gap. Departing from Dunkeld, travel via Penhurst to reach Port Fairy. Port Fairy is a quaint fishing village with many limestone and bluestone buildings in the town dating back to the 1840's and classified by the National Trust.

DAY 06: Port Fairy to Apollo Bay (188 km)

This morning depart Port Fairy and travel towards Warrnambool. Continue along the "Shipwreck Coast" and you will come across "London Bridge" – the broken arch, before reaching Port Campbell, a quaint little seaside town. Travelling on past Port Campbell you will first come to Loch Ard Gorge and then a short distance on, the Twelve Apostles, which are huge stone rock formations carved over time by the waves of this rugged coastline. After Cape Otway re-join the coastline and the unmatched scenery which is the Great Ocean Road.

DAY 07: Apollo Bay to Melbourne (197 km)

The scenic coastline from Apollo Bay to Lorne has been described as one of the most beautiful and breathtaking drives in the world. Near Lorne, visit the beautiful Erskine Falls, before following the coast road through Anglesea and Torquay, recognised as the surfing capital of Australia. From Torquay, travel north to Geelong, the largest provincial city in Victoria. Continue from Geelong along the freeway to cross the West Gate Bridge and arrive in the vibrant city of Melbourne.

Your vehicle is booked until tomorrow and should be returned by the same time it was collected on Day 1 to avoid additional charges.

DAY 01: Adelaide to Kangaroo Island (107 km to Cape Jervis)

From Adelaide Airport take the flight to Kingscote on Kangaroo Island to collect the vehicle. The coastline of the island changes from the attractive curved beach at Emu Bay. On the west are two of the island's natural wonders; Admirals Arch, and the Remarkable Rocks

DAY 02: Kangaroo Island

Today you have time to explore the natural beauty of this island and discover Australian wildlife – in the wild! Highlights include Flinders Chase National Park, Kelly Hill Caves, the "Koala Walk" and the seals at Seal Bay.

DAY 03: Kangaroo Island to Adelaide

More time to explore the Island before dropping the vehicle off at Kingscote Airport for the return flight to Adelaide.

DAY 04: Adelaide to Mount Gambier (435 km)

Collect your vehicle this morning before taking the Freeway directly to Murray Bridge and then onto Tailem Bend. Travel along the Coorong National Park skirting Lake Albert and Lake Alexandria. Travel on through Kingston and Robe and on to Mount Gambier, where you can visit the surrounding crater lakes and the Sunken Garden.

DAY 05: Mount Gambier to Halls Gap (230 km)

Leaving Mount Gambier and South Australia travel into Victoria and pass through the towns of Casterton, Coleraine, and Hamilton before reaching Dunkeld. From Dunkeld a scenic drive will take you through the Grampians National Park and onto Halls Gap. Highlights within the Grampians include McKenzie Falls. Reids Lookout and the Balconies.

DAY 06: Halls Gap

Explore the spectacular scenery that is the Grampians National Park. Take one of the many walks and remember your camera.

DAY 07: Halls Gap to Warrnambool (164 km)

ravel via Dunkeld and Penhurst to reach Warrnambool, which marks the start of your trek along the Great Ocean Road. If you wish to detour west, Port Fairy is located 28 kilometres from Warrnambool.

DAY 08: Warrnambool to Apollo Bay (161 km)

Depart Warrnambool and before arriving in Port Campbell you will see London Bridge – the broken arch. Travel to Port Campbell along what is commonly regarded as the 'Shipwreck Coast'. See the amazing rock formations of the Twelve Apostles, which are huge stone pillars sticking out of the surf, carved over time by the crashing Southern Ocean waves. Continue through the Otway National Park to Apollo Bay.

DAY 09: Apollo Bay to Melbourne (197 km)

The scenic coastline from Apollo Bay to Lorne has been described as one of the most beautiful and breathtaking drives in the world. Near Lorne, visit the beautiful Erskine Falls, before following the coast road through Anglesea and Torquay, recognised as the surfing capital of Australia. From Torquay, travel north to Geelong, the largest provincial city in Victoria. Continue from Geelong along the freeway to cross the West Gate Bridge and arrive in the vibrant city of Melbourne.
