5 DAYS / 4 NIGHTS FOOD & WINE TRAIL Launceston to Launceston

When it comes to food and wine, the Tamar Valley and the North Western Coast of Tasmania are pure indulgence. Boasting a large range of cellar doors, roadside stalls and farmers markets to visit along the way, this region of Tasmania will not leave any food and wine lover disappointed.

DAY 1: Launceston

Collect your vehicle at any time this morning and enjoy the day exploring Launceston. Visit the James Boags Brewery or take a walk around cataract gorge.

DAY 2: Launceston to Stanley (224 km)

Travel through Deloraine and take a slight detour to taste smoked baby salmon at 41 Degrees South Salmon and Ginseng Farm before heading up to Devonport. Enjoy any of the numerous roadside stalls and produce farmers markets on the way to Stanley as you drive along the coast line.

DAY 3: Stanley

Buy a fresh crayfish from Stanley wharf and have a picnic at one of the deserted beaches, then visit Providore 24 to take home some Tasmanian gourmet produce. Dine at the award winning Old Cable Station, or for a casual dining option try the bistro at the Stanley Hotel; this is a food lover's dream!

DAY 4: Stanley to Devonport (127 km)

Make your way back towards Devonport and stop off at Boat Harbour, take a stroll along Boat Harbour Beach and enjoy lunch at a local café. Travel along to Burnie to sample some cheese at Lactos Cheese Factory, then head south to enjoy award winning whiskey at Hellyer's Road Whiskey Distillery before spending the night in Devonport.

DAY 5: Devonport to Launceston (100 km)

Travel south, pick up some handmade chocolates from House of Anvers, located just outside Latrobe. Continue on to Elizabeth Town, stopping for a bite at Christmas Hills Raspberry Farm and artisan cheese at Ashgrove Cheese. On your way back to Launceston, stop in at the Tasmanian Gourmet Sauce Company at Evandale for some treats to take home. Your car is booked until tomorrow and should be returned to the airport or city by the same time as it was picked up on Day 1 to avoid any additional charges.

6 DAYS / 5 NIGHTS WILD TASMANIA Launceston to Hobart



Be awed by the stunning beaches, unspoiled national parks and breathtaking landscape of Tasmania's East Coast as you travel from Hobart in the south to Launceston in the north.

DAY 01: Hobart

On arrival in Hobart collect the vehicle and then the rest of the day is at leisure to explore Hobart. Hobart is an attractive city built around a beautiful Harbour and in the shadow of Mount Wellington. Places of interest include, the Royal Botanical Gardens, Constitution Dock, Sandy Bay, Salamanca Place and Battery Point.

DAY 02: Hobart to Richmond (26 km)

Travel across the Derwent River this morning and head to Richmond, a historic village with many treasures of Tasmania's colonial past. The much photographed Richmond Bridge is the oldest surviving freestone bridge in Australia (1823-25). Wander streets lined with sandstone buildings that now serve as showplaces for the best of Tasmania's fine art and crafts.

DAY 03: Richmond to Freycinet National Park (163 km)

Travel the east Coast today via Orford, where the Church of St John has a beautiful 14th Century stained glass window. Nearby walk the coast track from Shelley Beach to Spring Beach or just take in the coastal views. Continue on to Triabunna, a former whaling base, before arriving at Swansea, a great spot for lunch.

Don't miss a stop at the famous berry farm south of Swansea or visit some of the local wineries. Visit the Bark Mill and East Coast Museum before continuing on to the Freycinet Peninsula and Freycinet National Park.

DAY 04: Freycinet National Park

Enjoy time at leisure today to explore all that Freycinet National Park has to offer, including abundant wildlife, spectacular beaches including Wineglass Bay and a variety of walking trails.

DAY 05: Freycinet National Park to Launceston (167 km)

Travel north through Coles Bay and Bicheno. You can either take the coast road from Chain of Lagoons to Falmouth, or the inland road via St Marys and Elephant Pass, where you can stop for delicious pancakes. Then continue north to St Helens, perhaps with a detour to the beautiful Binalong Bay. Near Pyengana take a walk at St Columba Falls and buy some local gourmet cheese. Continue north to Scottsdale on the Tasman Highway and onto Launceston, Tasmania's second largest city, nestled in the hilly country where the Tamar, North Esk and South Esk rivers meet. Only 10 minutes from the city centre is the magnificent Cataract Gorge, here almost vertical cliffs line the banks of the South Esk River as it enters the Tamar.

DAY 06: Launceston

Your vehicle needs to be returned today, by the same time as it was picked up on Day 1 to avoid any additional charges.



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10 DAYS / 9 NIGHTS GRAND CIRCLE Hobart to Hobart



When it comes to food and wine, the Tamar Valley and the North Western Coast of Tasmania are pure indulgence. Boasting a large range of cellar doors, roadside stalls and farmers markets to visit along the way, this region of Tasmania will not leave any food and wine lover disappointed.

DAY 1: Hobart

On arrival in Hobart collect the vehicle and then the rest of the day is at leisure to explore Hobart. Hobart is an attractive city built around a beautiful Harbour in the shadow of Mount Wellington. Places of interest include, the Royal Botanical Gardens, Constitution Dock, Sandy Bay, Salamanca Place and Battery Point.

DAY 02: Hobart to Strahan (300 km)

Depart Hobart this morning and travel via New Norfolk on the Lyall Highway – a spectacular road across the heart of Tasmania to the village of Strahan. Continue through the Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park. A number of excellent short walks lead off the highway to rainforests, waterfalls and spectacular lookouts. Stop in Queenstown, surrounded by stark mountains, giving the town an eerie look. There are good views from Spion Kop Lookout, in the centre of town. Continue as the road winds along to the quiet town of Strahan, situated on Macquarie Harbour. Strahan is the only town on Tasmania's forbidding west coast.

DAY 03: Strahan to Cradle Mountain National Park (138 km)

This morning you can take an optional cruise along the Gordon River. Cruises depart at 9am and return at 2pm. Depart Strahan and travel north to Zeehan, which was a booming mining town in the early 1900's. The Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park is renowned for its walking tracks with spectacular mountain peaks, deep gorges, lakes, wild open moorlands and an incredible variety of wildlife.

DAY 04: Cradle Mountain National Park

Today is at your leisure to explore Cradle Mountain National Park including the many walks and spectacular scenery.

DAY 05: Cradle Mountain National Park to Launceston (141 km)

Depart Cradle Mountain and travel east to Mole Creek. Along the way visit Marakoopa Cave, a wet cave which features two underground streams and an incredible glow-worm display. Continue east to Deloraine. You can also take short detours to visit some local gourmet delights such as local honey and cheese producers as well as a raspberry farm. Continue onto Launceston, the 'Garden City', the second largest city in Tasmania, and the centre of Tasmania's north. It is nestled in the hilly country where the Tamar, North Esk and South Esk rivers meet. Only 10 minutes from the city centre is the magnificent Cataract Gorge, here almost vertical cliffs line the banks of the South Esk River as it enters the Tamar.

DAY 06: Launceston to St Helens (160 km)

Depart Launceston and travel north-east to Scottsdale, regarded as the hub of the North East serving some of the richest agricultural and forest country in Tasmania. Near Pyengana take a walk to St Columba Falls and pick up some local gourmet cheese. Continue east to the small bayside town of St Helens, a fishing port well known for its crayfish, flounder and scallops. Visit The Gardens and the Bay of Fires Coastal Reserves near Binalong Bay for stunning beaches.

DAY 07: St Helens to Freycinet National Park (108 km)

Travel south to Freycinet National Park. Along the way travel through the towns of Scamander and St Mary's, before stopping for pancakes at Elephant Pass. Or take the coast road from Falmouth to the Chain of Lagoons. Stop at the small resort town of Bicheno before continuing south through Coles Bay to the Freycinet National Park. Stop along the way to explore the Friendly Beaches.

DAY 08: Freycinet National Park

Time at leisure today to explore all that the Freycinet National Park has to offer, including abundant wildlife, spectacular beaches including Wineglass Bay and a variety of walking trails.

DAY 09: Freycinet National Park to Hobart (185 km)

Make an early start this morning, as you depart Freycinet perhaps make a stop near Swansea at one of the local wineries or berry farm. Cross the Derwent River to reach Hobart on the Tasman Highway. If time permits you can also travel back to Hobart via the historic village of Richmond, with many treasures of Tasmania's colonial past.

DAY 10: Hobart

Your vehicle needs to be returned today, by the same time as it was picked up on Day 1 to avoid any additional charges.
